



Judge apprentice

The goal with the apprenticing is to do judging behind an official judge and to watch and learn how different judges put on a program and do their scoring. It is advantageous if the apprentice can participate when the official judge setup the field and exercises.

The apprentice should do his/hers own scoring without any influence from the official judge. It is important that the apprentice motivates each penalty. After each category is done, the apprentice scores should be compared with the official scores, after that is done, the official judge signs the apprentice score sheets. It is important that the apprentice don't change his/hers scoring after comparing to the official judging.

If there is a big discrepancy between the scoresheets, the apprentice can write a motivation on the back of the scoresheet to explain why a different judging compared to the official judge.

The official judge should fill in the evaluation after the trial is over regarding:

Appearance – dressed appropriately, appropriate language

Knowledge of rules – shows knowledge about the rules

Accurate penalties - the apprentice had knowledge of points/penalties and did accurate scoring

Accuracy correct penalties in the scoresheet - is penalties done in the correct part start/attack/recall/A.G, AG at the right place on the score sheets

Relationship with competitors/decoys/field helpers – how the apprentice had communication with the competitors/decoys/field helpers, communicates clearly, friendly and considerate

After comparing the scoresheets and when the trial is over the official judge fill in the "Evaluation form Mondoring judge apprentice".

The apprentice emails a copy his/hers score sheets, the official scoresheets and the Evaluation to the judges in charge for the education.
